Commissioner Moses to Discuss Bronx **Bridges at Annual Spring Luncheon**

Bronx improvements planned by the Park Department and the Triborough Bridge Authority will be described by Commissioner Robert Moses at the annual Spring luncheon of The Bronx Board of Trade to be held in the Concourse Plaza on Thursday noon, April 29th.

Held each year as a review of civic activities, the luncheon is expected to be attended not only by members and friends of the Board of Trade, but also by representatives of other civic organizations in The Bronx and from other boroughs of the City. Hon. Roderick Stephens, President of The Bronx Board of Trade and Bronx member of the Triborough Bridge Authority will preside at the luncheon. He will introduce Borough President James J. Lyons who will present Commissioner Moses.
