

The Secretary was instructed by the Finance Committee to collect for proportions of a years dues.

Mr. Rousseau submitted the following resolution in writing

RESOLVED, That we endorse the Conklin Bill relating to granting the right to any City or Town the right to vote whether they should build and operate the means of transit through the same.

It moved by Mr. De Hart that Mr. Rousseau get and present

the bill. Seconded by Judge Hall Carried.

Mr. De Hart presented a copy of an act to prohibit the formation of Pools, Trusts, and Combines and moved to strike out the clause referring to Labor Societies and that the bill with specifications be referred to the Legislative Committee and to report back to this Board. Carried.

The following resolution in writing was introduced by Mr. Knoeppel.

RESOLVED, That the North Side Board of Trade thoroughly endorse the effort being made in the Legislature to secure the immediate enactment of a law annexing to New York City the Parks belonging to the City, and the interlying territory leading to those Parks.

RESOLVED, That the bill for annexing the Parks and territory south of the Parks, introduced in the Assembly by Assemblyman Stewart, and in the Senate by Senator Robertson, meets with the approval of this Board and after a full consideration of its provisions we endorse the same and urge its passage by the Legislature without amendmant.

RESOLVED, That a copy of these resolutions be forwarded to the Senators and members representing the district included in our territory, and that they be urged to do all their power to secure the immediate passage of said bill.

It was recommended that the portion covered be adopted.

Judge Hall stated that the bill covered more than the line to Yonkers. Pelham Bay Park and park lands might be taken into the City and thought best to pass this bill first.
